2017 Electronics Recycling Guide

Pennsylvania's Covered Device Recycling Act (CDRA) states that effective in January, 2013, landfills may no longer accept electronics. These items must be recycled. Items included in this disposal ban are televisions, computers (including monitors, keyboards, mice, printers), and cell phones. This guide was developed to assist the public with finding responsible ways to recycle their electronics.

Recycling Centers:

1. **ECS&R:** Evans City, Butler County.

Drop-off Hours: Scheduled Saturdays throughout the year.

Pre-registration is required.

Accepts: All electronics, household hazardous wastes, batteries, fluorescent

lights, and chemicals.

Notes: Fees apply. Call the toll free number, 866-815-0016 to register.

2. ECS&R: Route 19 North in Cochranton, Crawford County.

Hours: Monday – Friday from 9:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Accepts: All electronics, household hazardous wastes, batteries, fluorescent

lights, and chemicals.

Notes: Fees apply. Call 866-815-0016 for more information. They also offer

a Point & Pack Service that picks up items from your home for an

extra fee.

3. BEAVER COUNTY RECYCLING CENTER: Brady's Run Park, Beaver County.

Hours: Tuesdays & Thursdays from 9 AM- 4 PM.

Accepts: Electronics including televisions, computers, monitors, VCR's &

printers, batteries, polystyrene #6 (Styrofoam), antifreeze, used oil,

and fluorescent lights.

Notes: Fees apply. Call 724-770-2064 for more information.

Municipal Programs for Residents Only:

- 1. **City of Sharon:** Residents of the City of Sharon may call the toll free number 1-866-815-0016 to make arrangements with ECSR for the monthly, curbside pick-up of electronics.
- City of Farrell: Residents of Farrell may contact the City's Public Works/Code
 Department at 724-983-2703 Extension 105 to make arrangements for the curbside
 pick-up of electronics.
- 3. **Greenville Borough:** Residents of Greenville Borough may call Tri County Industries at 1-800-457-8202 to set up a collection appointment for electronics and household

hazardous waste (some limitations apply). Tri County offers the "At-the-Door Household Hazardous Waste & Electronic Waste Collection" service to provide year-round HHW collections for residents of Greenville Borough through a municipal contract.

- 4. **Jamestown Borough:** Contact the Waste Management Call Center at 1-800-449-7587 to set up a collection appointment for electronics and household hazardous waste (some limitations apply). WM offers the "At Your Door Special Collection" service to provide year-round HHW collections for residents of the Borough through a municipal contract.
- 5. City of Hermitage: Residents of the City of Hermitage can take electronics to the City Garage located on Virginia Road. Collections are held weekly, year-round on Friday's from 7 AM- Noon. This program is for Hermitage residents ONLY since it is part of the City's garbage and recycling contract with Tri-County Industries. Questions: (724) 981-0800 or www.hermitage.net.

Retail Drop-off Locations:

- -1. **Best Buy:** Retail stores accept up to three (3) items per household per day at no cost. For a fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) each, OHIO stores ONLY will accept up to two televisions (CRT's smaller than 32" and flat panel smaller than 50") or two computer monitors per household per day. Retail stores are located in:
 - Boardman (The Shops East), Ohio (330-758-6430)
 - Niles (Near Eastwood Mall), Ohio (330-544-1487)
 - Cranberry Township, Butler County (724-778-8300) ***

*** NO TV's or computer monitors are accepted at Pennsylvania (PA) stores.

Accepts: Nearly anything electronic including computer accessories, cell phones, DVD players, satellite receivers, game consoles, tablets, etc. No large or small kitchen appliances, microwaves, or console TV's. For a complete list visit www.bestbuy.com/recycling or call your local store.

2. **Staples:** Hermitage (724-342-0439) or New Castle (724-654-2099).

Accepts: Computers, laptops, printers, copiers, scanners, shredders, cameras, and phones any brand, any condition, even if purchased somewhere else. Also accepts batteries and printer cartridges.

3. Nellcom Technologies: 2722 Wilmington Road in New Castle. 724-654-4007

Accepts: Computer related equipment including laptops, desktops, scanners, routers, printers, processors, etc. NO televisions, VCR's, appliances and non-computer related material.

Notes: No appointment required. Call or visit <u>nellcom.net</u> for more information.

4. Lark Enterprises: 2665 Ellwood Road in New Castle. 724-658-5676

Accepts: Laptops, digital cameras, iPods, cell phones, printer cartridges.

Notes: Drop-off hours are between 8 AM and 3 PM.

Mail-Back Programs:

- 1. There are many mail-back programs that allow consumers to get rid of their electronics with a prepaid shipping label. Walmart, Sams Club, Staples, and Waste Management are just a few options.
- 2. Most computer companies that sell these items offer a take- back program. If you are purchasing a new computer, check with the company when purchasing to see if they will accept your old computer through a mail-back or similar program.

Miscellaneous Items:

- 1. A public recycling drop-off station is located <u>inside</u> of the Lawrence County Courthouse. Items accepted include the following:
 - o Compact Fluorescent Lightbulbs (CFL's)
 - o Fluorescent tubes (less than 4 foot)
 - o CD's, DVD's, VHS tapes, and floppy discs
 - o Shoes (pairs only, no holes)
 - o Cell phones
 - o Christmas lights (strands only)
- 2. Automotive Batteries (Lead Acid)
 - Some scrap yards accept these batteries.
