There were four residents present.

A motion was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, and seconded by Supervisor, Johnathan Leyshon to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the April 9, 2025 Regular Meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, announced approximately one mile of Buckeye Drive will be seal coated by PennDOT through the Agility Program and with schools soon to be out for summer watch for children.
