

South Pymatuning Township Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the South Pymatuning Township Board of Supervisors was opened at 6:00 p.m. with Supervisors Matthew Chalupka, Chairman, Johnathan Leyshon, Michael Anglin and Solicitor James Nevant present.

The meeting was opened with the pledge to the flag.

There were twenty-six residents present.

A motion was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, and seconded by Supervisor, Johnathan Leyshon to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the January 5, 2026, Organizational Meeting and Regular Meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, announced an Executive Session was held on February 4, 2026, at 5:30 p.m. for personnel issues.

The Police Department report was given by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and the Fire Department Report was given by Fire Department member, Yvonne Robison.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, announced the following approved building permits: Lennon, 2894 Tamarack Drive – fence and Raatz, 1899 Cricket Lane - fence.

A motion to pay the bills totaling \$133,893.78 and the January payrolls totaling \$74,893.42 was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka and seconded by Supervisor Michael Anglin. The motion was passed unanimously.

There was no correspondence or old business.

A motion by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, to adopt an amendment to Resolution No. 10-2025, retroactive to February 5, 2026, establishing ownership of the Sharpsville Inclusive Play and Accessibility Fund, hereby requesting a Local Share Grant of \$400,000.00 from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for the development of an Inclusive Playground. The motion was seconded by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and was passed unanimously.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, made a motion to approve the Final Ronald A. Samol Subdivision Lot No. 5. The motion was seconded by Michael Anglin and unanimously approved.

A motion to amend Application for Permit for the Use of Township Facilities, No. 2 Rental Fees. To set rental use at \$350.000 per day and all security costs to be set before each event was made by Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman. Supervisor Johnathan Leyshon seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

County Commissioner Ann Coleman presented the 2025 highlights of the County.

Resident Stan Nolf presented positive comments regarding the Road Crew work during the recent snow storm.

There was a lengthy discussion concerning the strong odor generated by the Dairy Farmers of American facility located on Oneida Lane. Chairman Chalupka stated he has been in touch with the dairy and the situation is being looked into. He stated the dairy was hoping to find a solution to the problem within a couple of weeks.
