

South Pymatuning Township Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the South Pymatuning Township Board of Supervisors was opened at 6:00 p.m. with Supervisors Matthew Chalupka, Chairman, Johnathan Leyshon, Michael Anglin and Solicitor James Nevant present.

The meeting was opened with the pledge to the flag.

There were seven residents present.

A motion was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, and seconded by Supervisor, Johnathan Leyshon to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the February 11, 2026, Regular Meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, announced warmer weather will be here shortly so watch for motorcycles.

The Police Department report was given by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and the Fire Department Report was given by Supervisor, Michael Anglin.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, announced the following approved building permits: Crislip, 849 Buckeye Drive – solar roof panels and Garasich, 5273 Tamarack Drive - shed.

A motion to pay the bills totaling \$150,729.95 and the February payrolls totaling \$70,663.97 was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka and seconded by Supervisor Michael Anglin. The motion was passed unanimously.

There was no correspondence or old business.

A motion by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, to approve Final Lot 1 and Lot 2 Good Ohl Boy Subdivision Plan. The motion was seconded by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and was passed unanimously.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, announced the Township was considering involvement in the Strategic Management Planning Program (STM). This program is through the Department of Community and Economic Development and is designed for local governments to develop long-term management, administrative, service delivery and economic development strategies.

Resident Jim Keating, Crestview Drive, stated he had police need at 2:00 a.m. and there was no patrolman on duty. Supervisor Chairman, Chalupka, stated he would speak with the Police Chief about the situation. He also commented we have been discussing with other departments regarding police coverage.

There was a discussion about the odor from Dairy Farmers of America facility. The Dairy has hired an individual and installed equipment to monitor the processes regarding the odor situation. Residents present stated the odor situation has improved.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:22 p.m.
