South Pymatuning Township Regular Meeting

The Regular Meeting of the South Pymatuning Township Board of Supervisors was opened at 6:00 p.m. with Supervisors Matthew Chalupka, Chairman, Johnathan Leyshon, Michael Anglin and Solicitor James Nevant present.

The meeting was opened with the pledge to the flag.

There were eight residents present.

A motion was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, and seconded by Supervisor, Johnathan Leyshon to dispense with the reading and approve the minutes of the March 11, 2026, Regular Meeting. The motion was unanimously approved.

The Police Department report was given by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and the Fire Department Report was given by Supervisor, Michael Anglin.

Matthew Chalupka, Supervisor Chairman, announced the following approved building permits: Gaines, 3850 Wynwood Drive - garage

A motion to pay the bills totaling \$187,283.92 and the March payrolls totaling \$76,856.11 was made by Chairman, Matthew Chalupka and seconded by Supervisor Michael Anglin. The motion was passed unanimously.

There was no correspondence or old business.

A motion by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka, to submit a Financial Assistance Application to the Pennsylvania Infrastructure Investment Authority (PENNVEST) for the purpose of financing the construction extension of the water system. The motion was seconded by Johnathan Leyshon, Supervisor and was passed unanimously.

A motion to hire IAG Consulting to undertake a comprehensive update of the Township Zoning Ordinance, and approve all requests public hearings, date to be set and legal notices published at a later date was made by Supervisor Chairman, Matthew Chalupka and seconded by Michael Anglin. The motion was unanimously approved.

It was announced the Township would be looking to hire a summer employee.

Resident Jim Keating, Crestview Drive, asked about police coverage and resident Ron Abbott, Saranac Drive, inquired about the proposed water extension for Saranac Drive.

Walter Kilgore, Blue Jay Drive, stated he has been taxed on Blue Jay, Cardinal and Hummingbird Drives since the development was built. Attorney Nevant will research the situation.

A motion to adjourn the meeting 6:12 p.m. was made by Chairman Matthew Chalupka, seconded by Johnathan Leyshon and was unanimously approved.
